SECURITY COMMITTEE

The Birch Bay Village Security Committee met on December 10th, with a major portion of the agenda being devoted to the regularly scheduled court session.

The Security Committee acts as your liaison to both our security force and the BBV Board of Directors, and stands ready to hear and address any security or safety issues brought before it by residents of the Village.

Two current items that should be addressed, for the safety of all, are as follows:

Washington State Vehicle Laws do apply on the roadways within Birch Bay Village. This means that only vehicles properly registered and licensed can be operated on our roadways, and can only be operated by licensed drivers.

These rules directly apply to and prohibit the operation of unregistered ATVs and smaller motorized vehicles within the village. Mini-Cycles, Pocket Rockets, and similar vehicles such as motorized skateboards, are specifically banned from operation within Birch Bay Village.

The second issue is that of the safety of children playing and sledding on the roadways in the snow. All drivers need to be aware and be on the lookout for them.

At the same time, it is incumbent both on those children and their parents to remember that vehicles continue to use the roadways as well, and the practice of sledding down our steeper hills after dark is extremely unsafe.

It should also be remembered that it is both unsafe and a violation of the law to throw anything at vehicles moving on the roadway, including snowballs.

Let's all help each other keep Birch Bay Village the safe and enjoyable place we all want it to be.
